0,000 ARE NOW TRAINED IN THE EDUCATION

TORONTO, Jan. 24.—The total enrollment in evening classes for the study of industrial technical and commercial subjects in Ontario this winter reaches thirty thousand, according to reports which have been received by Hon. R. H. Grant, Minister of Education. This is an increase of about seventy-five per cent over last year, and does not include attendance of partially disabled persons receiving vocational training at day classes under the direction of the Soldiers' Aid Commission. These soldiers' classes have, however, indirectly affected the attendance at day schools, because many men who have completed day courses continue their instruction at the evening classes.

MANY BRUTAL C MITTED IN TORONTO

LONDON, Jan. 25.—It is learned that a former resident of Toronto figures as the victim of one of the most brutal crimes which have been occurring so frequently here. The victim, Mrs. Francis Buxton, who lived alone as the proprietress of the Cross Keys Public House, Chelsea, was last week discovered murdered in the cellar of her home. An attempt also had been made to burn the body in a pile of sawdust. Mrs. Buxton was 53 years of age and was the wife of Frank Charles Buxton, the proprietor of a public house at Besshill. They had not lived together for twelve years. The husband stated that the dead woman was Francis Buxton, who in 1898 married in Toronto, where she was a member of the choir of Dr. Williams' church. They left for England alone immediately after his wife even associated herself with the Suffragist movement, and they found it a painful experience to separate. He went to jail and at the conclusion of his term received a friendly letter from his wife expressing pleasure at his return.

No arrest has yet been made. It
