The Revival of Trade.

The prompt and pronounced revival of trade immediately following the elections in Canada and the United States is a matter for general congratulation. At the same time it indicates the immense influence of the quadrennial political excitement upon industrial conditions, more especially in the United States. In Canada the influence is much less noticeable, and it is a question whether the reflex of industrial conditions across the line is not a more potent factor than anticipated changes in our domestic politics.

Nothing is certain according to the poet of economics, but death and taxes. It has long been a close question which of these processes aggrieved humanity the more. But it ought to be apparent that taxes nowadays are on a different basis. While the contribution is still forced, the force used is that of the people themselves. In a democratic community taxes are nothing but cooperative contributions to the common good. But still they are not paid cheerfully because of the lurking suspicion that equality does not prevail. Perhaps equality never will prevail any more in this than in other directions. It would seem therefore, to be wrong for economic writers to continue to promise the unattainable, instead of turning
