Telephone service in China is conned almost exclusively to the principal cities. With the exception of a few short and scattered toll lines, there are practically no facilities for telephone intercommunication, so that the telephone exchanges in the cities are independent of each other. As regards ownership and operation, there are four distinct classes of exchanges in the country: (1) those Underwood Typewriter, \$155.00. owned by the central government at telephones, which is about 20 per to such runaway matches.
