MUCH MARRIED. Some Sarnia and Port Huron People Badly Mixed Up. PORT HURON, Mich., March 17.-A very much complicated case, in which

charges of bigamy are made on both sides by an alleged husband and wife, has developed here. About eighteen months ago George Mempstead, of this city, was married to Eliza Mason, of Sarnia, both being members of the Salvation Army.
