## CITY WILL ASK \$9,200 PENALTY

Westinghouse Company Did Not Install Power Machinery Within the Proper Time.

### METER CHARGE REBATE

Water Commissioners Will Ask the Dominion Government to Cut Down the Cost of Inspection at London.

The water commissioners will take up the question of the charge for meter inspection imposed by the Dominion Government. At their meeting yesterday afternoon a statement was made by Mr. A. P. Nash, stating that no more meters would be inspected until the bill against the commissioners, amounting to \$9,200, was paid. "I think the city of London is good for the bill," declared Chairman Pocock. "We are not going out of business, and I think the department could have inspected the meters without any such trouble. We are charged 75 cents each for lighting meters and \$6 for power meters. That is altogether too much, particularly when we will have some thousands of these meters to be inspected. I stated that we would take the matter up with the Government, and we have already sent a communication to them. Some concession should be made under the circumstances."

"Let us pay the bill in the meantime and ask for a rebate," suggested Commissioner Marr. "It looks like an excessive charge."

This was agreed to, and Chairman Pocock will continue his negotiations with the Dominion Government.

The hospital trust wrote asking for an estimate of the cost of installing Niagara power at Victoria Hospital. Engineer Gaultz will take the matter up at once with them.

Manager Dark suggested that the Westinghouse Company be penalized for not having their machinery at the Horton street plant installed according to contract. In a letter to the board he pointed out that the work should have been finished Oct. 28, but it was not completed until Jan. 21. At \$100 a day, the penalty would be \$9,200.

"They claim that the building was not completed in time for them to go ahead with their work," declared Mr. Dark.

"We had better charge them for the full 92 days," suggested Commissioner Pocock. "If they put in a counter-claim, we will consider it."

Commissioner Stevenson moved to that effect, and the motion carried.

Engineer Gaultz suggested a Bristol recording meter for the Horton street station to cost \$25. His recommendation was accepted, and the machine will be ordered.

**Operating Plan.**  
Mr. Gaultz presented a plan for the operation of the power stations in the city. Three operators would be employed at Springbank, the second at the present time. Three chief operators and three assistants would be necessary for the operation of the Horton street plant. These would be added to handle No. 2 station in the east and west.

The operators will work 8-hour shifts and the assistants 10 hours for a time," declared Mr. Gaultz. "With that staff we will be able to handle the various plants."

The recommendations were accepted. The operators will get from \$60 to \$75 a month, and the assistants \$50 to \$60.

**No Definition of Duties.**  
There was nothing done regarding the definition of the duties of Engineer Gaultz and Manager Dark. According to information obtained from the commissioners' matters are being satisfactorily arranged, and that for the time being at least there will be no difficulty.

The Springfield pumping engineer's report showed that the daily average water in the reservoir during the lowest depth of water in the reservoir during the half month was 12 feet 8 inches.

## ONE DEATH FROM TYPHOID DURING THE PAST YEAR

Record Is a Splendid One—M. H. O. on the Health of the City.

At the meeting of the board of health held last night, Dr. T. V. Hutchinson, M. H. O., presented his annual report. He stated that the health of the city during 1910 was excellent. The sanitary condition is good, as was demonstrated that only one death from typhoid fever occurred during the year, the same as in 1909. This was a remarkable record.

The total number of deaths from all causes was 739. Pneumonia was first cause, with 54 deaths, with tuberculosis second, with 42, as compared with 40 in 1909.

Cancer showed a decided falling off, 35 deaths being recorded from this disease as compared with 49 the year previous. There were 209 cases of scarlet fever with 9 deaths, showing the disease to have been a mild type. There were 7 deaths from diphtheria, with 99 cases reported.

During the year there were 23 violent deaths, 4 as follows: Accidents, 12; suicides, 4; railway accidents, 4; drownings, 5. The water supply of the city was analyzed at regular intervals and found to be pure and free from impurities. The work of the London Milk Commission was traced the origin of the commission, and its method of procedure. Great credit was paid to Dr. H. A. MacCallum, Dr. H. A. MacCallum, Dr. H. A. ## NORTH MIDLAND WAS LAID OVER

Matter of Agreement Is Now in the Hands of City Solicitor Meredith.

CITY AND THE IMPERIAL

Ground Is Taken That the Company Should Secure Its Own Charter—Meeting of the Finance Committee.

At the meeting of the finance committee yesterday afternoon a request was presented from the Imperial Traction Company, an electric road project, to build a line from Niagara Falls to St. Catharines, that the city council endorse the scheme by forwarding a favorable resolution to Ottawa.

Mayor Beattie proposed the motion, stating that the promoters should obtain their own charter, and when that was done the city council would be in a position to do business with them.

"I do not think we should discuss the cause of any railway," said his worship. "They want our support in obtaining a charter, and I am not in favor of that. Allow them to get their own charter. If we assist them, they will come to us and ask us to discuss the question with them."

The East End Progressive Association asked for the free use of the East End Hall for meetings, but the request was not granted, as the hall is for public use.

The "Gift of Tongues" organization wanted to rent some rooms in the East End Hall to hold religious services. The hall was referred to Ald. Eckert to report on.

The North Midland. The chairman reported that the agreement and specifications submitted by the North Midland Railway were in the hands of City Solicitor Meredith, and when he had the company had finally come to an understanding the matter would again be brought before the committee.

City Clerk Eklund made a requisition for 5,000 booklets, "Facts About London." They will be secured at once. The tender of the London Printing and Lithographing Company for lithographing the city of London documents, amounting to \$36,390, now offered for sale, was accepted. They will do the work for \$120.

Other routine business was transacted. Those present were: Ald. Eckert, chairman; Ald. Bennett, Ald. Richter, Mayor Beattie and Secretary Baker.
