If the premier should be defeated in Halton the date may be further postponed. The U. F. O. members are in training for the opening and have been studying the rules of the legislative assembly and copies of the votes and proceedings of a previous session.

### GERMANS WILL REFUSE TO TAKE INTO CUSTODY THOSE WANTED BY ALLIES FOR CRIMES DURING WAR

Note Is Sent by Berlin Government to Entente Powers Asking a Revision of Clauses of Versailles Treaty That Call For Extradition and Trial of German War Criminals.

Berlin, Jan. 28.—Indication of the government's growing concern over the extradition of Germans accused of war offences was given in the note sent to the Allies today, asking revision of clauses of the Versailles treaty. The note, which was sent to the Allies last Monday, is viewed in official circles as a precursor of what is likely to happen on a larger scale if the government, yielding to the Allies, appeals to the Entente powers to force the extradition of men on the list submitted by the Entente powers. ### LOCAL MAN NOT NEEDED

Just Scheme To Make Adjustment of Complaints More Difficult.

Is the Union Government shirking its responsibilities in regard to the high cost of living and attempting to "pass the buck" to the municipalities of the Dominion? Recent matters before No. 1 committee of the city council have made Ald. O. T. Cunningham, chairman of the committee, begin to think this is the case.

The board of commerce has asked the city to appoint a local representative of the board. This official will be expected to act without salary. Matters requiring the attention of the board of commerce would be submitted to him. He would look them over and then forward them to the board. No. 1 committee has laid this matter over for further consideration.

"The government is kind of shirking its responsibility and shoving it on to the municipality by the look of that," said Ald. Cunningham. As there is no salary attached to the position it is obvious that it will not be any wide rush to fill it unless the city takes it upon itself to pay for the work. It is highly likely that the council will be enthusiastic about any such propositions as that. Those who think it is federal work also think that it should be paid by the federal government.

In addition they are somewhat doubtful as to what good the appointment would do. They think that it would merely create another channel through which complaints regarding high prices would have to wend their way. They would thus be still further delayed in reaching the only organization which has any power to deal with them.

### BRITISH LABOR LEADERS DEMAND RUSSIAN PEACE

Maintain That Continuance of Conflict Is Inexcusable.

### WARNING IS ISSUED

### Heads of Labor Party Declare

### Foreign Policy Is All Wrong.

London, Jan. 29.—Complete and immediate peace for soviet Russia is demanded by a manifesto signed by eighteen prominent labor leaders, including John Robert Clynes, former food controller; James Henry Thomas, general secretary of the national union of railway men; and William Brace, miners' leader. The signatories assert that they "do not subscribe to the political social theories on which the Soviet Government is based," but contend that a continuance of the state of war is inexcusable, and that the course of least risk found is peace. They maintain that if the Soviet Government is merely imposing its power on the Russian people by tyranny, it is believed that the people are oppressed by privation and hunger, and that those conditions will be perpetuated by a state of war, the horrors of which will fall not upon the tyrannical government, but upon the peasants, women and children. The manifesto denounces "the intrigues of the great powers and their 'proposal to use alien satellite armies to prosecute a war which their own soldiers have refused to wage'—indicating among the 'satellites' Japan and Poland. It concludes by declaring that the Labor party, if it comes into power or influence, will not regard itself bound by military or diplomatic commitments made secretly and in defiance of the foreign policy to which the Labor party is pledged."

### \$10,000 Smoking Room Opened For Women In Chicago Theatre

Chicago, Jan. 29.—A Chicago theatre today announced it had opened a smoking-room for women. The manager said the "women's lounge" was a "first-class" place, and he found them smoking in the washroom, the boudoir and the lobby. The women smoke more cigarettes than the men, the manager said. The smoking-room was outfitted at a cost of \$10,000.

### Quebec Deriving Greater Revenue Under Prohibition

Provincial Government Profits Well Under Dry Law.

Montreal, Jan. 29.—From May 1 last, when prohibition went into effect, until the last available figures, presumably January 1, the Montreal Gazette, the Quebec to the Montreal Gazette, the provincial government has received a total of \$1,000,000 in revenue from the prohibition law. Under the old license conditions, the revenue was only a little over \$800,000 annually, so under prohibition the revenue will be larger since the figures available are only for eight months.

### Marquis of Queensberry Is Broke; Depends On Friends

Meets His Creditors and Signs Receiving Order.

London, Jan. 29.—The Marquis of Queensberry has had a receiving order made against him, and today attended the first meeting of his creditors since his case was left in the hands of the official receiver. The debtor's statement showed liabilities of £12,500, and no assets except a third interest in a twenty per cent commission note relating to a port wine deal. Early last year the marquis went to Canada to obtain options on oil and mineral properties and expended £1,500 which was not returned. His wife paid into the Royal Bank of Canada £1,500 which was to be settled on him, but settlement was never executed. He afterwards went to money lenders and was now being supported by his friends and relatives.

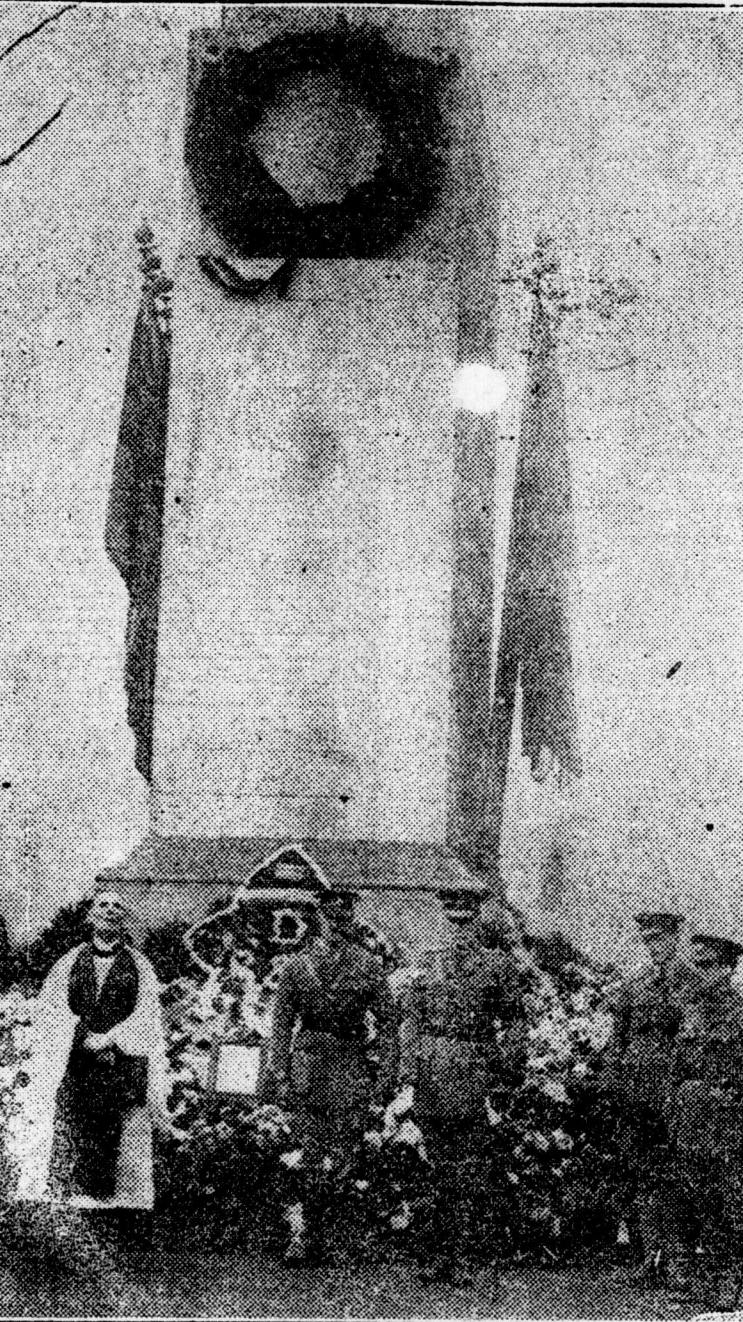

### BRITISH SCIENTISTS AT ODDS ON MARCONI CLAIM; SOME SAY MARS TRIES TO SIGNAL EARTH

London, Jan. 29.—All London is discussing the Marconi suggestions of wireless signals from Mars. Famous scientists are giving their opinion to the press on the subject. While some agree with the theory that the mysterious "intermissions" emanating from other planets, many cast doubt upon the theory. The superintendent engineer of the Marconi firm goes so far as to state that "the Marconians are probably of a few hundred years ago. They are wireless for hundreds of years. They are a sufficiently sensitive receiver they have picked up some of our messages in code and word and the meaning of them. That is not at all far-fetched. We did the same thing with German messages during the war. If they have this, it is almost certain they will get into touch with the earth at regular intervals. This is a point on which careful investigations must be made and exact records kept before anything certain can be said. We have not been looking out for a program and may have missed it so far." Professor J. E. Esch, one of the leading wireless telegraphists in this country, agrees with the theory of Marconi that Mars is trying to signal the earth. He says: "One thing would prove or disprove that Mars is trying to signal the earth. When that planet is nearest to the earth, the supposed messages should be received more frequently than when it is farther away from us. If this could be settled by careful experiment and the matter would be decided. These queer noises are well known in wireless telegraphy.
