VARSITY STADIUM, Dec. 3.—The Argos won the Canadian senior rugby championship here this afternoon, by defeating the Edmonton Eskimos in the final game by the score of 23 to 0, in a game in which the score was hardly a correct indication of the play, as the visitors gave the interprovincial champions a harder battle than the score signifies. The new champions have gone through the season without a defeat, today's victory being their ninth straight since the season opened on Oct. 1, and they have scored 226 points in their opponents' 55.

Greatest Ever.
The Eskimos came close of the West, and as the greatest team ever assembled in the Prairie Provinces, and while they made a better team than any team today they are far from disgraced, and the 12,000 spectators have a higher opinion of the Western players than the Argos. One and perhaps the greatest weakness of the team was the small number of substitutes, this compelled the Western players when injured to remain in the game instead of getting the necessary rest, and towards the end of the game the strenuous play showed them up a great deal.
