Rose pointed out that school districts were not generally known in the city, and mis-understanding regarding boundaries might be responsible for some trouble. Inspector V. K. Greer explained that absolutely no discrimination had been shown in the placing of children in schools. But he was only too glad, he said, of cases where partiality might be felt, were pointed out.


