TSUBURA, Pa., Aug. 9.—Ravages of cholera in Japan are set forth this week in reports received from Miss Anna Davis, of Davis, missionary in Japan. Herebefore, the United States, cholera has been confined to certain places and densely populated cities, but, owing to the war, soldiers have been everywhere and cholera has followed them.
