Frozen Wheat.

After the many stories which we have been hearing of drawbacks and discouragements experienced by settlers in the Northwest, it is cheering to read the account given by Mr. Williamson and published in the World yesterday, of the highly successful start made by the Pickering syndicate in the Qu'Appelle district.

The high commissioner to England says: "As to Manitoba, the Northwest and Canada generally, they have never stood so high in the estimation of the British public as at present."

It will be observed that they report a wheat crop of 44 bushels per acre, and nothing is said about any portion of it having been frozen. But it will further be noticed that they give the benefits of early sowing, some of the land having been twice plowed the year before, and therefore ready for sowing at the earliest opening of the season.
