TOM MOORE IS HONORED BY WORLD'S LABOR CONGRESS

LONDON, Oct. 30--Tom Moore, of Canada, is among the six workers' delegates to the International Labor Congress elected to the governing body of the International labor office, says a Reuter dispatch from Geneva.

The dispatch adds that at a session today of the committee which organized the congress, which lasted for an hour, Hon. James Curran, another member of the Canadian delegation, explained the misunderstanding over the election of the vice-presidents of the labor bureau, which resulted in the resignations last week of five of the delegates.

MEANWHILE the Fascist army in Rome, including some from outside who had previously entered the city, celebrated their triumph informally by night parades through the town, undaunted by frequent heavy showers.

QUEBEC, Oct. 31--Rising on a question of privilege just as the afternoon session of the Provincial House opened here yesterday, Premier Taschereau moved, seconded by Hon. J. E. Caron, a resolution that the Hon. H. Roberts, editor of a Montreal weekly publication, The Axe, be arrested and brought before the bar of the Legislative Assembly on Thursday, November 2, to answer to a charge of "violating the honor of the Legislature."

GENEVA, Oct. 31--In the election held yesterday to choose four countries to be represented on the International Labor Conference Council, Spain received 44 votes, Chile 41, Finland 40 and Poland 40. Three other countries which were not elected were Switzerland, with 14 votes; Brazil 4; Holland 4; and Czechoslovakia 2. The countries previously chosen to membership on the council remain, England, France, Germany, Canada, Italy, Japan, Belgium and India. If any increase in the number of the council is voted, it will be reserved for men that they are satisfied by the various governments.

McGill Gets Strange Fossil From Limestone of Bermuda. MONTREAL, Oct. 31--McGill University has been presented with a prehistoric egg, laid probably 1,000,000 years ago by a Phaethon Flaviviridis. It was discovered in Bermuda in 1915 at a native village called Tuckestown, which was being transformed into a golf course. The discovery was made 15 feet below the earth's surface in a limestone formation, known to geologists as the "Fossil" formation. It is really a fossil of the shell, the yolk and white having evaporated before fossilization set in many thousand years ago. Col. Casey Wood made the presentation.

TOO MANY TRIES GET INTO FIGHT

Co-Operative Pact of Parties May Go To Smash. 160 L. G. MEN IN THE FIELD But Party Has Reserve of 250 Others To Call On.

LONDON, Oct. 31--(Associated Press Cable). The so-called co-operative pact between Governmental Conservatives and the Lloyd Georgian National Liberals, which yesterday appeared to be gaining strength, to-day seemed near a smash-up that may force Lloyd George to really carry his threat to spread the war and wage a bitter fight to the finish with the men who brought about his downfall.

One trouble seems to be that Conservative candidates have bobbed up against those running under the Lloyd George banner in certain constituencies where the latter had regarded themselves as safe from Tory attacks. Lloyd George is represented as being indignant and as contemplating the carrying out of his threat if the Conservative party does not withdraw some of the candidates already entered against his followers.

At this time the Lloyd Georgians have about 160 candidates in the field and they are reported to be using 250 in reserve. It is said to be Lloyd George's intention to let loose these reserves against the Conservatives unless his demands are met. The co-operative pact--a sort of "you leave us alone in this district and we won't bother you in that district" understanding--first attracted attention through the anger of the die-hards at the prospect of a return to coalition rule under theegis of a new Government.

SULTAN'S ABDICATION OUT OF QUESTION NOW. CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 31--Abdication of the Sultan is temporarily out of the question. A truce has been arranged with the Nationalists whereby his status will be held in abeyance until after the conclusion of peace in the near east. This information was given to the Associated Press by the chief of staff representing Rafet Pasha, Turkish Nationalist military governor of Thrace, who for four hours yesterday was conferred with the sultan in his palace.
