Scientific and Useful.

CHOCOLATE CREAMS.—Take two cups of powdered sugar and one-half cup of fresh milk; boil till soft candy, then mould into drops, and dip in melted chocolate.

CHOCOLATE CARAMELS.—Two pounds of good brown sugar, one-half cup of fresh butter, one cup of fresh milk, one-half cake of Baker's chocolate; boil till it will harden when dropped in water. When done, pour into a flat buttered dish, and then cut in squares when nearly cool. Let the caramels be about one-fourth of an inch thick.

COCONUT CANDY.—Two and a half cups of granulated sugar, three-fourths of a cup of boiling water, one-fourth cup of vinegar, butter the size of an egg; boil till soft candy; then add a heaping cup of grated coconut, after well dried off in the oven. Let it boil up two or three times, and drop on buttered dishes to harden, or put it in one large dish and cut in squares when cool.

CLEANING AND COOKING PIG'S FEET.—The horny parts can be removed by first holding in boiling water, or in the fire. Scrape and clean thoroughly, singeing any remaining hairs, and wash. Boil slowly for several hours until perfectly tender. May be packed away in vinegar pickle, or simply salted, as preferred.

A TOOTHSONE AND ECONOMICAL CAKE.—Stir well into one pint of corn meal, one and a half pints of boiling water and one teaspoonful of salt. Cover and let it remain one hour to swell. Then add one teacup of wheat flour and two teaspoonfuls of baking powder. Then reduce with cold water to a batter (not too thick). Have the griddle hot, and bake the cakes small. Have the plate warm with a piece of butter on it, and place a small piece between each cake to prevent them sticking together. Serve hot.

CURRIED BEEF.—Curried beef is a favourite supper dish in some families. Take slices of cold roast beef, cut them up into small bits, put a large piece of butter into a saucepan, and put the meat into it with two onions, sliced very thin, a little water, one dessert spoonful of curry powder. Let this simmer for ten or fifteen minutes. Line an earthen vegetable dish with boiled rice and pour the curried beef into it. Serve hot.

COOKING MACKEREL.—Mackerel, which is so common a breakfast dish in inland towns; need not be so uninviting as it sometimes is. If freshened properly, that is, long enough, say from five o'clock until seven next morning, one objection to it will be removed. Wrap the mackerel in a cloth and boil it in just enough water to cover it well. Let it boil gently for twenty minutes and fit will be tender and yet will not fall apart. Melt a little butter, add cream to it, and sprinkle parsley, rubbed fine, over it. Or to vary it use a little melted butter with lemon juice, or a little vinegar. Gooseberry sauce or currant catsup may be used with the melted butter also.
