Noting also the ongoing activity of the Ad Hoc Group of Scientific Experts to Consider International Cooperative Measures to Detect and Identify Seismic Events,

- 1. <u>Welcomes</u> the decision <u>3</u>/ taken by the Conference on Disarmament on 10 August 1993 to give its Ad Hoc Committee on a Nuclear Test Ban a mandate to negotiate a universal and internationally and effectively verifiable comprehensive test-ban treaty, and fully endorses the contents of that decision;
- 2. <u>Calls upon</u> participants in the Conference on Disarmament to approach the inter-sessional consultations mandated by that decision in a positive and constructive light;
- 3. <u>Urges</u> the Conference on Disarmament at the commencement of its 1994 session to re-establish, with an appropriate negotiating mandate, the Ad Hoc Committee on its agenda item entitled "Nuclear test ban";
- 4. <u>Calls upon</u> all States to support the multilateral negotiations in the Conference on Disarmament for a comprehensive test-ban treaty;
- 5. Also urges the Conference on Disarmament to proceed intensively, as a priority task, in its negotiation of such a universal and internationally and effectively verifiable treaty;
- 6. Requests the Secretary-General to ensure the provision to the Conference on Disarmament of additional administrative, substantive and conference support services for these negotiations;
- 7. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-ninth session an item entitled "Comprehensive test-ban treaty".
