Establishment of Joint British and United States Atomic Energy Commission, Report on the Establishment of Atomic Energy Commission, June 11, 1945

Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King (Prime Minister) promised my hon. friend the leader of the Cooperative Commonwealth Federation (Mr. C. Lewis) that I would give him a brief statement to-day with respect to closer co-operation of United Kingdom and United States Atomic Energy Commission, to which he made reference yesterday.

The Canadian government has fully welcomed the new arrangements for the closer co-operation of the United Kingdom and United States Atomic Energy Commission, which were announced in Washington on June 9.
