PRAYERS.

Mr. Martin (Essex East), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of Communique issued at the conclusion of the meeting of the Ministerial Council of the Organization for Economic Co-Operation and Development (O.E.C.D.) held in Paris on November 19, and 20, 1963. (English and French).

By unanimous consent, it was ordered that the said Communique be printed as an Appendix to this day's *Hansard*.
