

PRAYERS.

The following petitions were severally presented:—

By the Honourable the Chairman of the Committee on Divorce:—

Of Lucy Violet Siggins Hopson, of the village of Val Tetreau, in the county of Hull, in the province of Quebec, and at present residing at the city of Ottawa, in the province of Ontario; praying for the passage of an Act to dissolve her marriage with Albert Hopson, of the said village of Val Tetreau.
