**Mr. Martin:** Mr. Speaker, I was paired with the hon. member for Cape Breton South (Mr. Gillis). Had I voted I would have voted against the motion.

**Mr. Speaker:** I declare the motion lost. In connection with the subject matter that was raised before six o'clock and on which I had commenced to give a ruling, I did indicate that the theory referred to by the hon. member for Winnipeg South Centre had to do with the eventuality that when in committee of the whole the members wished, with the concurrence of the chairman of the committee, that a matter relating to procedure be referred to the Speaker. In order to obtain such a reference a motion must be made and if carried the matter is referred to the Speaker.

In cases where the chairman himself has doubts and does not wish to make a decision he may ask the committee to refer the matter to the Speaker, and upon someone making a motion to the effect that he leave the chair for that purpose, he makes a report in which he includes the subject matter on which he wants to have the decision of the Speaker.

The hon. member for Winnipeg South Centre in speaking about authority—in that instance Bourinot—quoted from Bourinot's fourth edition which was published in 1916. He did say that in a footnote Bourinot stated since 1885 there had been several instances. By "several instances" I do not think he meant any more than four or five.

In 1885, as recorded in columns 1509 and 1510 of *Hansard*, there was an instance of an appeal from a decision made by the chairman of the committee of the whole where this matter of appeal, as to whether it is to the house or to the Speaker, was debated, and Mr. Blake indicated as follows:

That reference is not to this appeal. This appeal is one to the house, not to the Speaker. I know it is competent to move that the committee rise with a view of obtaining the opinion of the highest
