SUGGESTED BILINGUAL REQUIREMENT FOR SEAWAY PILOTS—REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO MOVE MOTION

Mr. Tom Cossitt (Leeds): Mr. Speaker, I rise to ask permission of the House to move a motion under Standing Order 43 seconded by the hon. member for Winnipeg South Centre (Mr. McKenzie) that:

In view of English being the language of international marine communication, the House instructs the government, and in particular the Department of Transport, to take all necessary action toward preventing the Crown corporation known as the Laurentian Pilotage Authority, from making any attempts to institute a bilingual requirement for pilots on ships in the St. Lawrence seaway.
