CONSIDERATION OF MOTIONS.

No. 4. By Rev. G. W. Taylor, seconded by Rev. Canon Beanlands,—That in the opinion of this Synod, the grants from the Mission Board to the Missionary Clergy should, if possible, be paid monthly instead of quarterly as at present.—Carried.

No. 5. By Capt. Dillon, seconded by Dr. Praeger,—That the Secretaries be instructed at future assemblies of the Synod to apply to the E. & N. R. R. for tickets at reduced rates for such Lay Delegates as may propose attending, and who give him one weeks' notice in writing of their intention of being present.—Carried.

No. 6. By Dr. Praeger, seconded by Capt, Dillon,—That it is desirable that some provision be made for the revision of the Electoral Rolls in the various parishes of the Diccese.

After some discussion the motion, by consent of the Synod, was withdrawn, on the understanding that the matter would be inquired into by the Bishop and the Archdeacon.

Moved by Major Dupont, seconded by Hon. Mr. Justice Crease,—That this Synod is of opinion that greater interest will be taken by Lay Men.bers of the Church in Church work if they have an assurance that the appointment of the Incumbent of any rectory or parish will hereafter be made by his Lordship the Bishop in consultation with the Churchwardens and Church Committee and Lay Delegates of the congregation affected.—
