WINNIPEG, April 23. - At this morning's session of the royal com-mission, appointed to investigate the construction of the new parliament buildings, G. A. Elliott, K.C., appear-ing for Thomas Kelly & Sons, stated that Mr. Kelly had arranged to be represented by F. H. Phippen, K.C., of Toronto, general counsel of the C.N.R., and formerly a judge of the Manitoba Court of Appeals, and by W. N. Tilley, of Thompson, Tilley and Johnston of Toronto. It was expected that they would be in Winnipeg by Tuesday Chief Justice Mathers raised the
