## REGULATIONS

OF THE

# ROYAL SOCIETY OF CANADA.

(AS REVISED TO MAY, 1895.)

### 1. Objects of the Society.

The objects of the society are set forth in the preamble of the act of corporation as follows: first, to encourage studies and investigations in terature and science; secondly, to publish transactions annually or emi-annually, containing the minutes of proceedings at meetings, records of the work performed, original papers and memoirs of merit and such ther documents as may be deemed worthy of publication; thirdly, to fifer prizes or other inducements for valuable papers on subjects relating to Canada, and to aid researches already begun and carried so far as to render their ultimate value probable; fourthly, to assist in the collection of specimens with a view to the formation of a Canadian museum of rechives, ethnology, archæology and natural history.

#### 2. Name.

By the gracious permission of Her Majesty the Queen the society will bear the name of the Royal Society of Canada, and the members shall be entitled "Fellows of the Royal Society of Canada."

## 3. Honorary President and Patron.

His Excellency the Governor-General shall be the honorary president and patron of the society.

#### 4. Division into Sections.

The society shall consist of the four following sections:

- 1. French Literature, with History, Archæology and allied subjects.
- 2. English Literature, with History, Archæology and allied subjects.
- 3. Mathematical, Chemical and Physical Sciences.
- 4. Geological and Biological Sciences.
