THE Province of Canada, the most important as well as most advanced in local self-government of all the Colonies of Great Britain, is now well-known to all classes of persons as presenting a most eligible field for emigration. She does not, it is true, share in the exciting race after gold offered by Australia, but she holds out the more solid advantages of comfortable subsistence to the Farmer, the Mechanic, and the Labourer, under a well-organized Government, having widely spread *Municipal Institutions, excellent Free Schools* throughout the length and breadth of the land, abundant means of *Religious Instruction* for all shades of opinion. But although Canada, as a Province of the British Empire, is thus favourably known, and has consequently attracted a large class of industrious Emigrants to her shores, the practical advantages of this influx of population have been hitherto almost exclusively given to that portion of the Province bordering on the great lakes, known as the Upper Province, or Canada West.

The Lower Province has been looked upon in the light of a French Colony only, governed by French laws, speaking the French language, and having, therefore,
