

Directions to the Learner.

In the first place put before you a large colored map of the country, the topography of which you are studying, with all the required divisions and places distinctly marked upon it. Then read over six or seven of the key-words, slowly and distinctly, until you have thoroughly memorized them. Now proceed to read these key-words, as your eye follows the places you are committing to memory. Repeat this operation several times, until you get these places so distinctly marked upon your mind, that you can easily name them without the aid of the map. Then add six or seven more key-words to those first committed to memory, and proceed to learn the places they represent, until you have thoroughly mastered them, after which you, as above directed, will commence at the beginning, and repeat all the names with and without the key-words, until you find no difficulty in doing so, after which you can go on with additional key-words, until all the places are thoroughly committed to memory. You will bear in mind that the first letter of the county and of the key-word are always the same. Frequently the first syllable, and sometimes the whole word of each, are alike.
