LUTHERANS WILL OPEL CHURCH ON SUNDAY

Congregation of St. John's Has Made Good Progress, and Will Worship in New Edifice for First Time—School for Instruction in German Free of Charge Will Be a Feature.

St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, newly erected on Shaw-street, corner of Irene-avenue, just north of Bloor-street, will be formally opened and dedicated to the service of God on Sunday. The opening of this new church will be an event of special interest to Lutherans of this city, who will see in it a promise that the Lutheran Church, which is the largest Protestant denomination on earth and one of the largest in the United States, being strongly represented in all its important cities, will in the future make headway also in Toronto. The German element in Toronto will be especially interested, since the congregation will be divided into the German and the English work, it is really so for a German congregation. In the evening the dedication two festive divine services will be held, one at 11 a.m., in German; the other at 7 p.m., in English. In the morning the Rev. W. G. Jones of Berlin, Ont., president of the Canada District of the large Lutheran body with which the congregation is connected, will preach the sermon. In the evening the sermon will be delivered by the Rev. Rud. Ebert of Tavistock, Ont. All who may be interested are cordially invited. Hereafter, regular Sunday services will be held at 11 a.m. and at 7 p.m., the morning services being conducted in German, the evening services in English. Similarly, there will be German and English Sunday school classes. In connection with the church a school for instruction in the German language and its religion will be opened in the near future, such instruction to be free of charge by the pastor, Rev. Henry Hamann, to children whose parents are desirous of having them learn their mother tongue. The congregation has worshipped hitherto in Broadway Hall, 460 Spadina-street.

CARTIER MEMORIAL

One Hundred Thousand Dollars to Be Raised in Canada by Subscription. The 14th of September, 1914, will be the one hundredth anniversary of the birth of St. George Etienne Cartier, one of the illustrious statesmen whom Canada has produced. He was born in the old Parish of St. Antoine, County of Vecheves, Quebec. To celebrate the centenary of the patriot's birth it is the intention to erect in Montreal, by public subscription, a memorial to perpetuate the memory of this great statesman's birth. For this purpose it will be necessary to raise \$100,000, a substantial portion of which has been promised by public bodies. It is desired that a large part of the sum be subscribed by Canadians throughout Canada, in order that the memorial may be regarded as a popular tribute to the memory of Cartier and a stirring appeal to being published throughout the country. TAX RATE COMES DOWN BUT IT'S A HARD TASK

Controllers Are Aiming at 18 Mills, and Cut \$106,000 Off the Property Estimates—City Engineer Would Remove All Express Stands.

Thus far in their private sessions to deal with the estimates, the board of control have struck out items which will lower the tax rate one and one-quarter mills from what it would have had the estimates passed without alterations. It is known that the board are making an effort to secure an 18-mill tax rate, and it is also known that they are experiencing considerable difficulty in this connection. In their session yesterday afternoon they dealt with the fire and light estimates and Mayor Geary stated afterwards that only slight changes were made. The board have not yet dealt with the question of salaries. In this work yesterday morning the controllers dealt with the estimates of the property department and reduced the original estimates by \$106,000, of which sum \$11,000 was taken from the street cleaning department. Controller Hooken contended that the council could not legally substitute the name of Charles Chambers for that of Thomas Hogg, whom the board recommended for the position of parks commissioner. He claims that even with a two-thirds vote the council have no right to substitute a name, and only in the absence of a nomination by the board can they make an appointment. The matter was referred to Corporation Counsel Drayton for a report. Controller Hooken believes it would be wise for the city to acquire the Knox College property on Spadina-avenue, and at the private meeting of the board of control yesterday morning, he moved that the assessment commissioner and the parks commissioner be asked to report upon the advisability of securing this property. The controller believes that if purchased at once it could be obtained for \$250,000. Viaduct Estimates. City Engineer Rust stated yesterday

of the extension changed so that their property will not be damaged. More Poles. In his fortnightly report City Engineer Rust recommends that the Bell Telephone Co. be permitted to plant poles on the following streets: Allan-ave, Argyle-st., Atlantic-ave, Brookfield-st., Clinton-st., Davenport-road, Fleet-ave, Gerard-st., Helena-ave, Hilton-ave, Hendrick-ave, Jones-ave, Humbervale-ave, Logan-ave, Nina-ave, Summerhill-ave, Standish-ave, Tiverton-ave, Victor-ave, and Wolfray-avenue.

Mr. Rust, in his report, also recommends that vehicular traffic be prohibited as far as possible on the car tracks, as it causes the rails to spread. He also suggests the removal of all express stands from the city streets. In his report he also favors the use of Trails on the streets. This type of rail was not approved of by the city council at a recent meeting. Mr. Rust does not advise the extension of the Adelaide-street car line in order to connect it with the Dovercourt line, claiming that this is unnecessary.
