

Provincial rights in regard to the incorporation of companies will be the subject of a legal battle before the supreme court at Ottawa on May 7. C. H. Ritchie, K. C., and Thomas Mulvey, K. C., assistant provincial secretary, will represent Ontario. The case will probably go to the privy council.
