Montréal Live Stock.

MONTRÉAL, Sept. 4.—(Special.)—About 550 head of butchers' cattle and 250 fat hogs were offered for sale at the east and about 1000 head of calves and yearlings really good cattle on the market and there was a slow demand for good or interior quality.

Prices were paid. A few of the best cattle sold at from \$34 to \$35 per lb. Most of the calves were good veal sold at from \$2 to \$2 1/2 per lb. Good veal sold at \$4 to \$5 per lb. Sheep sold at about \$4 1/2 per lb. and the lambs at about \$4 1/2 to \$5 per lb.

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CAMP IS BY THE TRAINERS' STRIKE

Many Are Returning to Former Employment—New Strike Reported at Foster.

COBALT, Sept. 4.—(From the Man on the Spot.)—Cobalt's output for the past two months shows no decrease; instead, there has been a slight increase.

The idea that the strike was going to stop the camp has proved a myth, and to-day, at some of the mines fighting the union, the superintendents remark that they have a better force of men than they ever had.

Superintendent Jones and the Buffalo Mine are particularly obnoxious to the local agitators, who have a full force of men who went away at the beginning of the strike are returning and going back to work. Some of these are good men who have a better force of men than they ever had.

It does not follow that the strike has injured the camp, as has very materially. It has also given some properties a good excuse to close down, and some of them may never start up again.

The strike has lasted a couple of months. The loss in wages for this length of time makes no appeal on the part of the men, but many of the men are beginning to figure up what the cost has been.

Unfortunately the wages asked were not the stumbling block, but the recognition (implied by yielding) of the union was the mine-owners' balk.

Roadhouse's violent abuse of the mine owners has only intensified this determination.

Output for Eight Months.

Cobalt's output for the first eight months of the current year has been \$948,878 tons, or an average monthly output of \$118,609.

The average monthly output for the first six months was 1071.84 tons. Figures do not lie, and the camp's output is increasing and will continue to increase.

During the period mentioned twenty-four mines have been shipmanned, 21 of which are now producing.

Temiskaming and Hudson Bay, Townsite and Nova Scotia have shown that they are now among the "regulars."

MacKintley-Darrah, LaSalle, Foster have re-established themselves, and the former will in the future prove one of the big shippers.

Helen and Cobalt Lake have become carloads of ore ready, and the King Edward is sacking as rich ore as any.

With increased staffs at work, the probability is that the month of September will witness the biggest output of the camp's history.

Silver Leaf has made a good shipment, and will follow it up with another as the result of development work.

Big Truethway has been from the Evans and Imperial Cobalt has proved that shipping ore is to be found in what is generally considered a "dry" place.

That section of the camp owes much to the enterprise of Mr. Evans and to the Edison Mine. A lot of conscientious work. It will be good news to his friends to know that a genuine find has been made.

Ed's prospect, which is 150 feet deep, has been six-inch cobalt-silver vein, and is believed to carry good silver values. The property was bought by Mr. Foster, who has been in the camp for some time, but this is not correct.
