

CATTLE EXCLUSION BILL

PASSES ITS SECOND READING IN THE IMPERIAL HOUSE.

The Measure Means Permanent Exclusion and the Practical Ruin of the Canadian Export Trade of Live Cattle—The House of Lords will Never Repeal It.

London, March 23.—In the House of Commons to-day, Mr. J. M. White, Liberal member for Forfarshire, moved the rejection of the bill amending the Diseases of Animals Act of 1894, introduced by Mr. H. H. Long, president of the Board of Agriculture, which proposed making the restrictions placed upon the importation of cattle permanent, instead of leaving them to the discretion of the Board of Agriculture. In speaking to his motion, Mr. White said the measure, if it became law, might do a trifle of good, as against the enormous harm which would result to the food consumers in this country, and the injury to the colonies. It was, he declared, the silliest form of protection.

Mr. Robert Johnson Price, member for the East Division of Norfolk, seconded the motion. He said the bill was a serious menace to Canadian trade, and would injure the graziers of the United Kingdom. It was protection of the breeders against the feeders.

Right Hon. Sir George Trevelyan, who sits for the Bridgeton District of Glasgow, said that if the bill was passed the House would bind its own hands and those of future governments by an act which could not be repealed without the assent of the House of Lords, which would never assent to its repeal. The Conservatives, he said, would only pass the measure if it was to make practically impossible henceforth the importation of live cattle.

Mr. Long, the introducer of the bill, said the sole object of the measure was to give the owners of breeding stock in the United Kingdom that security without which they could not carry on their industry. The symptoms of pleuropneumonia, he said, were very obscure and difficult to find. The Board of Agriculture felt that they could not adequately perform their duty under present conditions, and asked Parliament to relieve them of a part of their task through the bill. Mr. Long said he did got believe that there had been an increase in the price of meat since the regulations requiring the slaughter of imported cattle at their ports of landing had been enforced, but on the contrary the number of cattle killed at the ports had increased and prices had been reduced.
