UNDER THE N.P. OUR COUNTRY WILL STILL PROSPER.

The Voice of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association—Free Trade and Tariff Pacts are Falsely—Annual Meeting of the Association—Election of Officers.

The importance and necessity of a protective policy was the keynote of all addresses and discussion at the twenty-third annual meeting of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association held yesterday in the offices of the association in the Canada Life building.

President Kemp's annual address was an able exposition of the tariff situation. He reviewed the history of the association from its inception in 1872 when a number of manufacturers, without regard to party distinction, consulted with each other on the question of tariff protection.

At the present time, he said, the first duty of those who had Canada's interest at heart was to see that the cause of protection to our industries was not dwarfed by questions of lesser importance.

The speaker explained at length the effect of the policy of free trade as it is in England, where, he said, "the free trade tax gatherer haunts every tea table, every candy store, dog kennel, gun rack, servants' hall, butcher's cottage, farm house, drug store, restaurant, trader's desk, and every bank office."

The benefits resulting from the National Policy were an annual increase of the great results was that manufactured goods as a general thing were as cheap in Canada as under protection in the United States.

The tariff protected Canadian industries while not destroying foreign competition, and gave value to many home productions, which, under circumstances, would be of little worth.

After describing the ill effects of the adoption of a free trade policy, Mr. Kemp gave many examples of the benefits derived from the National Policy, one of the most recent being the establishment in Canada of large bicycle factories, which without a protective tariff would hardly have gained a foothold in this country.

Some people, he said, are dazzled by the splendor and greatness of American enterprise, while they can see no good in their own country. We admire their pluck and noble, and we admire them. They have built up our neighbors on the principle of America for Americans. Let us imitate their national pride and self-reliance, but let us discountenance any sentiment which tends to belittle our own country and its institutions.

The first resolution adopted by the association was an emphatic endorsement of the National Policy, for reasons set forth as follows: "From its geographical position and commercial environments, the prosperity of Canada depends largely upon the maintenance of a tariff which will foster agriculture, mining, manufacturing and every other interest."


