strar Ryan in a Big Timber Limit Deal-A Loss of \$600 to Bind the Bargain Was Enough.

Mr. Justice Rose has given judgmen through whom the defendant claims, took a fee simple under the Crown grant of the lands in question to her, dated March 17, 1886. By the said patent the land was granted to Ann McDonald, her heirs and assigns forever, "to have and to hold unto her during the term of her natural life, or during widowhood, with remainder in fee simple to the persons entitled under the will of Donald McDonald, deceased."

The habendum thus contradicting the grant, the former is of no effect, and Ann takes a fee simple. The plaintiff's action, which is brought for partition or sale and for an account of the greats and profits of the land, is dismissed with costs.

Peter is on Tep.

In Fraser v. Ryan a Court of Appeal (composed of Boyd, C., Ferguson, J., band Robertson, J.) has given judgment on the appeal of the defendant from the judgment of Mr. Justice Street. The plaintiff agreed to sell to Mr. Peter Ryan a timber limit situated in the Township of Paterson, and on the ishore of Lake Nipissing. The price was \$115,000. Mr. Ryan gave \$500 in cash, a note for \$500 at 10 days, and the aremaining \$114,000 was to be paid in 130 days. When the note came due Mr. Ryan paid \$100 on account, and gave a new note for \$400. At the expiration of the 36 days the \$114,000 was not paid, and the plaintiff thereupon rescained the contract, and this action is to recover the amount of the new note, \$400. The defendant contends that, though the cash nayment may be forfeited to the plaintiff, he cannot recover on the note, the contract being at an end. The court held that the plaintiff cannot recover, and the note and allow the appeal with costs.


