LUETGERT WAS MOROSE. The Rebuttal Evidence for the Prosecution

Had a Rather Chilling Effect Upon Him. Chicago, Oct. 8.-The closing day of

the rebuttal evidence of the prosecution in the Luetgert trial opened this morning with a continuation of the crisp in ing with a continuation of the crisp impeachment evidence produced yesterday. Prof. George C. Dorsey, Field Columbian Museum, chief osteological expert for the State in this trial, was called to dispute the evidence of Dr. H. W. Allport, the principal expert for the defence. The youthful-appearing professor was loaded with information, and had some hot shot for Dr. Allport and the other scientific gentlemen whose testimony, if accepted in full, practically branded him as a stupid novice.
