BORDEN OF HALIFAX SPRINGS HIS BOMB

Will Move That the Poll Books, Etc., of the Brockville and West Huron Elections Be Produced.

Wants Them Examined and Investigated Before the Privileges and Elections Committee—What Will Senate Do With Grand Trunk Lease Bill?

Ottawa, July 5.—(Special.)—This has been an eventful day in both Houses in the Commons, besides an interesting debate on the London Times' condemnation of the Government for refusing a judicial investigation of the Yukon charges and the continuation of the debate on the Redistribution bill, Mr. Borden of Halifax threw a bombshell into the Government camp by rising in his place in the House and giving notice that he will to-morrow move that the clerk of the Crown in Chancery be ordered to produce, on Friday, the poll books, etc., in the Brockville and West Huron cases, and that he will then move that they be referred to the Committee on Privileges and Elections. In view of the disclosures in the West Elgin and South Ontario local elections, and the fact that the same gang has operated in these constituencies very much in evidence in Brockville and West Huron, Mr. Borden's motion to open up the last-named elections has given the Government "a pain," which not even a liberal dose of pink pills, administered by Mr. Conroy, M.P., for Brockville, can assuage. It is believed that the Government will "vote the motion down and burk enquire as to the Yukon scandals, but after the mass of corruption disclosed in the West Elgin and South Ontario cases and the close affiliation between the shabby Liberal Government and the equally shabby administration, it is doubtful whether the voting down of Mr. Borden's motion will not do the Government as much harm as a reference of the cases to the Committee on Privileges and Elections.

The other interesting event of the day occurred in the Senate, and was a sort of double event, as there were two motions, the second of which was the outcome of the first.

This morning the Conservative Senators indulged in the unusual recreation for them, of holding a caucus in the Dominion County and Grand Trunk Lease bill. The meeting can scarcely be regarded as having been anything but a success. Mr. Laurier's request for a judicial investigation into the administration of the Yukon, was in favor of passing it with the amendment.

The Premier received a telegram this morning from Mr. Tarte, announcing his resignation, and blaming the Dominion bill which had been greatly benefited by the voyage.

Sir Wilfrid Challenges the Competency of the Times to Deal With Yukon Charges.
