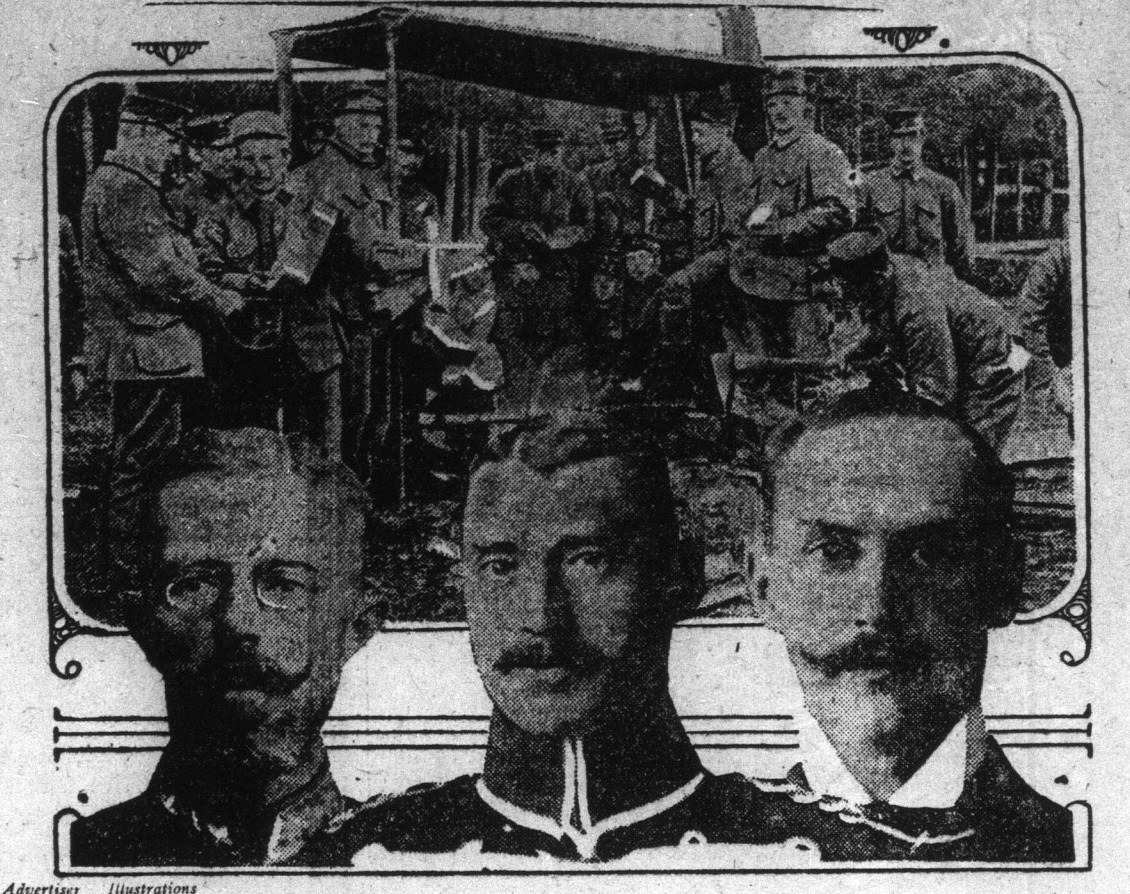

SIR HENRY DRAYTON MADE CONTROLLER OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY THROUGHOUT ONTARIO

Will Superintend Production and Distribution of Power.

TO CONFER WITH STATES

No Prohibition of Export, as Munitions Plants Across Line Would Be Affected.

Ottawa, Nov. 6.—Sir Henry Drayton, chairman of the board of railway commissioners, has been appointed controller of the production and distribution of electrical energy by companies generating or distributing electrical energy in the province of Ontario. The order-in-council, making the appointment, states that it will be the duty of the controller to determine preference and priorities in the supply of such electrical energy to the end that a sufficient supply shall be furnished to factories and users engaged, directly or indirectly, in munitions work or work for any of the allied governments, and also for municipal and public utility requirements.

Can Fix Prices. It is provided that in the event of a dispute between any user of electrical energy and any company the price at which energy shall be supplied to the user shall be fixed by the controller. It is also provided that as a great deal of energy is exported to the United States and that the war requirements of both governments that a conference be arranged between the controller and the Canadian authorities with a view to insuring the closest co-operation between Canada and the United States in the generation and utilization of energy on both sides of the boundary.

Heavy Penalties. Companies refusing or neglecting to comply with the terms of the order-in-council or regulations made by the controller shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$500 for each offence. It is also provided that any company which violates such orders or regulations shall be liable to a fine or imprisonment for any term not exceeding five years, or to both fine and imprisonment.

Sir Henry Drayton recently concluded an investigation into the exportation of power. In his report to the Government, he said:

"If the export of power were prohibited, the immediate effect would be to make available for munition plants in Canada; but, on the other hand, important manufacturing plants in the United States in which the allies are dependent would directly suffer. Their production would be curtailed and in some instances probably stopped. The overlying Canadian interest, as I stated, is to secure the best possible continued operation of munition plants both in Canada and the United States."

Sir Henry's recommendations have been generally adopted by the Government in the order-in-council.

HAVE NOT CONSENTED TO \$10,000,000 LIMIT

Ottawa, Nov. 7.—Sir William MacKenna, minister of finance, today announced that the Canadian Press Limited will not agree to have its capital limited to \$10,000,000 as required by the board of arbitration.

"So far as we are concerned," Sir William said, "there has been no consent to this limitation."

BRANTFORD YOUTHS ARE NOT RUSHING TO FILL OUT SERVICE PAPERS

Brantford, Nov. 7.—There is no big rush here on the part of young men to report to the military service act. But 40 registered in the past 24 hours, of whom 3 reported for service. But 75 have reported to date out of 1,700 examined, and but 31 are willing to serve. The rest are waiting for the men to report.

OVERHEATED MOTOR TO BLAME—An overheated motor in the basement of the Dunlop Tire and Rubber Company building, Richmond Street, near King, resulted in a general fire alarm being turned in at 10 o'clock last night. The fire was quickly extinguished, being principally due to smoke arising from the burning of oil.

PLUCKY FIRE FIGHTERS. Montreal, Nov. 7.—Firemen, led by Capt. Pearson, fought their way up two flights of stairs at 1511 West Notre Dame Street at 10 o'clock last night to rescue a man and a woman who had been overcome by smoke from fire. All returned safely.

GUILTY OF MANSLAUGHTER. Welland, Ont. Nov. 6.—Joseph Morbato, an Italian, who shot and killed a man here on April 15 last, was found guilty of manslaughter this afternoon by a jury in the assizes court. He will be sentenced tomorrow morning by Chief Justice Gendron to a term of five years in the penitentiary.

WETS LEADING IN OHIO STATE LIQUOR FIGHT

Anti-Prohibition Forces Were Ahead at Noon Today.

Cincinnati, O., Nov. 7.—With only 429 precincts to hear from, the anti-prohibition forces maintained a lead of 3,753 at noon today on detailed figures reported from all the counties in Ohio.

Harrison County sent an estimate that the county would go by 2,500 votes, but this estimate was not included in the precinct figures, which gave for 6,327 precincts out of 5,766 in Ohio; for prohibition, 47,881; against, 47,884.
