CREIGHTON IS INSANE PLEA FOR HIS DEFENCE

Lawyer Retained to Battle for His Life-Creighton's Own Story of Deed.

OWEN SOUND, May 28.—(Special.) -H. G. Tucker has been retained to act as counsel for James Creighton, who killed his. wife and two stepdaughters and then attempted suicide. The defence will be insanity.

"There can be no doubt but that this mild gentleman, who feared the sight of blood, was oppressed by a terrible mental aberration," said Mr. Tucker to-day. "The circumstances all prove it. I will appear at the inquest Thursday night and will have medical testimony to the effect that his mind bed gone."

Creighton himself told Chief Mc-Auley that he had intended that morning to kill himself.
"I went to the woodshed and got the pistol, loaded it with six cartridges

and I went in to where my wife slept.
I was determined to tell her why I wanted to die," said Creighton. "I was going to kiss her. Then when I looked at her asleep I thought it would be better that we should all go to-gether. So I took aim and shot her thru the heart. She never moved." He followed this up with the madman-like slashes of the dread knife, sharpened to a fine point. Then he drew the leather thong tight about her neck. He has told no one connectedly of this. "Then I left the room and made a job of the other two. I shot Kathleen thru the heart and then went to kill Clare. Clare was wakened by the last shot, and she put up a hard fight. As I stood over her with the pistol she came at me like a tiger, but I did not






