POLICE AT NEW YORK

AWAIT ROBT. CALDWELL

His Testimony in Druce Case is Utterly Shattered—Said He Put Lead in Coffin.

NEW YORK, Dec. 17.—Robert Caldwell, "the great American affidavit maker," whose testimony in the Druce perjury case in London caused mercurial on two continents, will be arrested at the request of the English authorities as soon as he arrives here on the steamship Kaiserin Auguste Victoria the latter part of this week.

Information that a warrant for his apprehension on the charge of perjury had been issued in London was received by cable yesterday, together with the statement that the New York police had been asked to detain him until extradition papers could arrive.

Caldwell's testimony, which was expected to establish the allegation that the fifth Duke of Portland and T. C. Druce, a London shopkeeper, were one and the same man, was given in the trial of the charge of perjury brought against Herbert Druce, a son of T. C. Druce, who had sworn at a previous trial that he saw his father lead and lying in his coffin. This was disputed by other descendants of Druce, who relied on Caldwell's statement that he had placed 200 pounds of lead in the coffin instead of the Duke of Portland and T. C. Druce, as Caldwell's testimony, his early evidence caused a sensation in England, and that he went last September for the purpose of being a witness in the case. It was not until the true history of Caldwell's life was unearthed at the time when he swore he was associated with the Duke of Portland in his proper person and as T. C. Druce, that his statements were successfully challenged.

The defence was able to base a cross-examination that completely shattered the carefully prepared tale he had told earlier in the case. He took refuge behind the allegation that he had a brother who had assumed his name and who was really the person known as Robert Caldwell in Ireland. When confronted with the record of the death and burial of his infant daughter in Londonderry, he declared that it must have been his brother's child of the same name and age.

Caldwell is more than 70 years old and is said to have become quite ill since giving his testimony.

An employment registration office will be opened at St. Andrew's Market to-day by the city, with the view of ascertaining the number of unemployed men in Toronto, so as to provide a basis for making requests to the Dominion and Provincial Governments that work be provided. The bureau will be under the direction of Industries Commissioner Thompson.

On Thursday a bureau will be opened for the convenience of those living in the eastern section at the yards on Eastern-avenue.

Owing to the Industrial Trust Company having taken out an injunction to prevent the construction of the Parkdale sewer by day labor, the work, which was to begin this morning, will have to be deferred for a few days at least. The city's legal department will sustain the injunction, and the Corporation Council Fullerton will argue the case at Osgoode Hall.

Arrangements had been made for the work to begin this morning. The start when made will be on Roncesvalles-avenue, south of Marmaduke-street, and forty or fifty men will be employed at the outset. The street will be in condition to be given to married men who are British subjects.

Three Thousand Out

The mayor said it had been reported to him that certain contractors were in the habit of receiving sums from foreigners in return for giving jobs. English-speaking subjects being discriminated against.

The statement that there were 3000 unemployed men in Toronto was made before the board of control yesterday by C. W. McEwen of the British Welcome League, who introduced a deputation of English immigrants who are out of work.

The mayor replied that registration didn't show so large a number, and that while the city would do all it could for the unemployed, the Dominion and Provincial Governments were responsible for the presence of immigrants in Toronto.
