Count von Hertling, the Bavarian premier, has been offered the chancellorship.

The announcement says Count von Hertling is now negotiating with the leaders of the reichstag parties.

Simply a Convenience.

Copenhagen, Oct. 31.—The possibility is being considered here that Count von Hertling is intended only as a chancellor for an unstated interval and that powers behind the scenes have desired to use him and Dr. Richter as a temporary place where the candidate whom Prof. Rudolf Vagant had intimidated the emperor was keeping in reserve for the peace negotiations.

The suggestion is that Count von Hertling is an unnatural and therefore probably temporary division of the office of chancellor and of prime minister, such as is proposed, suggests that the emperor's intention in making Count von Hertling's chancellorship is intended to last only until the threshold of the peace negotiations.
