that if a good pent Could be got at once, they would Consent, but I do not think they would do do on any other terms. Nowever, if it is Thought proper, I will Call a Meeting of the Indians in order to ascertain their views in regard to any place that might be proposed for the improvement of their Reserve. Owilization of the Indians and the improvement of their Heserves, I confess I am much discourages, Even if the land were cleaved and put in good order, to all appear ance the Indians would not Cultivate it. On the Kiver front there is some fine land, clear of Stemps and every obstruction; get I do not think one half of it is Cultivated by the Indians themselves. Last year Several fine fields were left untilled and grew nothing but weeds. In regard to other protions, the Indians arranged with while men, and let them have their fields for the Season. In what way habits of industry and self reliance Could be forstered among them, seems a prablem rather difficult to solve have the honor tobe Jana Oft Sommet Theneger Hatson Ind: Saft.
