Twenty families located on either side of Shoal River which is an outlet of Swan Lake into Lake Winnipegosis, the houses being scattered for a distance of 6 miles, some few having small potatoe patches attached. In all probability no white settlers will settle in this neighborhood as the land is during a part of the year quite inaccessible except by water.

As settlers are coming in and settling rapidly in the neighborhood of Fort Pelly it is desirable in order to prevent complications to have Kee-see-Koo's Reserve surveyed. (it adjoins that of Coté's) also that of The Key if the Department should think proper to grant them the land on which the twelve families have settled.
