Dear Sir: -

Consideration is to be given to the revision of our timber regulations which were established in 1923.

It is intended to consider the Provincial Timber Regulations with the view to the adoption of such provisions as may be general in the Regulations of the Provinces. It is advisable that our regulations should be in conformity with the Provincial Regulations in so far as these may be suitable for timber operations on Indian Reserves.

If you would forward three copies of your regulations governing the sale and cutting of timber, pulpwood, and fuelwood, and the collection of dues or stumpage, it would be appreciated.
