The new building at Truro for the Maritime Home for Girls, the contract for erection of which has been signed with F. H. & MacDonell, Halifax, is to cost slightly more than \$20,000. The material is now being placed on the site and the work is to be completed at the end of coming August. There will then be accommodation for about fifty girls and seven matrons, together with superintendent's office, an hospital apartment for one half dozen beds, laundry, school room, and store room. The building of two and one-half stories, to be of brick, will be eighty-eight feet by twenty-eight feet.
