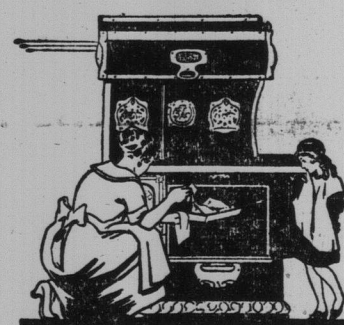

## Not Holding Back Many Fit Troops

London, Sept. 7, via Reuters Ottawa—The Ottawa agency has received the following authoritative statement regarding the respective parts played by the dominions and Great Britain in the war: "In America and elsewhere, the fable is current that large numbers of trained soldiers, fit for service overseas, are retained in idleness in the United Kingdom. The authors of this fable would like to spread the report that Britain's resources of men are exhausted. That is entirely untrue. The millions stated to be in reserve in this country include all men trained and trained to be in the five theatres of the war; also the sick and wounded, those unfit for general service, the training staffs and the labor and administrative units necessary at the main base of the empire."

"As regards the comparative efforts of

the Motherland and the dominions in the actual war areas, excluding the troops garrisoning India and the defended ports throughout the world, the proportion of troops of the Motherland to troops of the dominions is between five and six to one. It must be born in mind that this preponderance of troops of the Motherland is natural since the proportion of the white male population of the United Kingdom to that of the dominions is over three to one.

## Will Fight The Franchise Bill

Ottawa, Sept. 7.—At a Liberal caucus this morning the effect and meaning of the government's proposals for a new dominion franchise were considered. The cursory examination of the details of the bill which Liberals have thus far been able to make, have convinced them that both in principle and detail a strenuous fight must be put up against it. It is practically certain that the bill can only go through the commons under duress. It was decided that one of the first amendments to be proposed by Liberal members should be to wipe out the distinction in regard to women's votes by extending the franchise to all women on the same basis on which it has already been extended by the provincial legislatures. Liberals can see no sound reason for limiting the vote only to the female relatives of soldiers, who have gone overseas, while at the same time all other women no matter what may be their intelligence or war effort and sacrifice are barred.

## Canadians Busy

Canadian Army Headquarters, Sept. 7.—After a day of hard fighting following the attack by our troops in the Green Crassier area near Arras, the enemy counter-attacked this morning all along the front to the west of Lens. He succeeded, after several efforts, in driving us out of part of the positions, the coming of which was told of in yesterday's despatch, but in the region of Green Crassier the gains made by our men were not only held, but extended, and our new front constitutes a serious menace to the enemy positions along the northern side of the Souchez river. 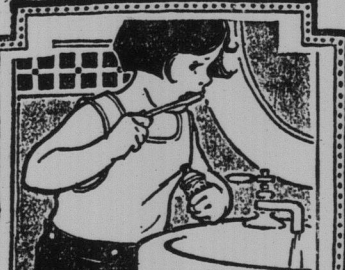

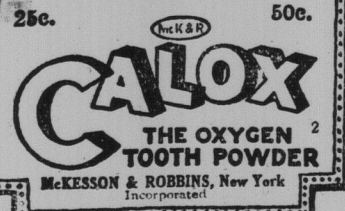
