NOVEL RAILROAD BRIDGE FOR RIVER IN JAMA

A bridge that is to be built for the Holland government railroad over the Serapipe River in Java has been made complete in the shops in Holland, and so carefully has this been done that no field work will be required in erecting the steel structure other than that of connecting the members.

The bridge site is far from any kind of shop facilities, and to make sure that the structure would go together properly it was first erected as carefully as if on its permanent location, in the yards of the manufacturing company in Holland.

Following this it was taken down and is to be shipped by steamer to Java. The bridge is of unusual design, consisting of three arched spans of steel connecting with short straight trusses over the piers. It has a total length of 698 ft. 10 in., and weighs 850 tons. It is designed to carry a single track railroad having a gauge of 5 ft. 6 in.—From the December Popular Mechanics Magazine.

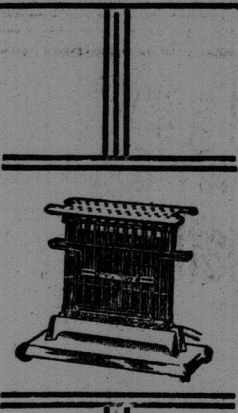

WOMEN OF FRANCE GIVEN HIGH PRAISE

But For Them Army Would Not Have Been So Well Supplied—25,000 on Railways

New York, Nov. 24.—Not fewer than 25,000 women are working on the railroads of France, according to the Railway Age Gazette. In an article under the title "The Efficiency of French Women as Railway Workers," the women of France are praised for their adaptability to all sorts of employment. The assertion is made that but for the women it would have been impossible to keep the French munitions factories going at the present high speed.

"If it is said in passing," says the article in that publication, "that Europe has for a long time seen women working as a manual laborer in the fields, as a fruit vendor, as a grocer or as a railway crossing tender, it does not enter into any sense of duty, or of shame if you will, in seeing her at a man's job. It is the laboring man once even watched her work from the standpoint of results. The laboring man once even watched her work with jealousy, seeing that her success meant lower wages and fewer places for him. Her work in the admiration and gratitude of the whole nation, for with less lead to cultivate owing to the German invasion she actually obtained a more abundant harvest than man had secured in past years."

RECORD OF CHILD CRIME STARTLING

Some Juveniles Already Have Long List of Offences—Big Increase This Year

(Ottawa Journal.)
Has the juvenile court in Ottawa proved itself a failure? The question was raised in police circles today. Child crime in the city has shown an astonishing increase over last year, and a remarkable feature of the case is the fact that the majority of the culprits come back again, time after time. In fact, some of the juveniles have police records which would put many a grown-up malefactor to shame.

Last year three hundred and twelve cases were dealt with in the children's court, and already this year's cases show an increase of seventeen over the total for 1914. Last year there were only ninety-four theft cases; this year there have been 66 charges of house and shop-breaking, against sixty-one for 1914.

"Nearly all our cases are old-timers," said one official. "In yesterday afternoon's court there was one boy who has already been before us five times this year. These youngsters," he added, "literally chase our ordinary regulars up a back alley for daring and devilry."

"Take yesterday's court," he instanced, "where there were three and twenty cases, and all were indictable offences except one, where a boy with the 'travel bug' was charged with stealing a bicycle from Montreal and back on the C. P. R."

"SLOW WORK," SAY MEN AT FRONT, "BUT WE'RE WINNING"

(Montreal Mail.)

"The universal opinion of men returning from the battle front is that 'it is slow work, but we are winning right along,'" was the statement made by Major H. G. Nybllett, C. A. M. G., who was the medical officer in charge of the 600 or so wounded or ill Canadians brought home on the Metagama recently.

"The men who have been in the trenches are decidedly more optimistic about the outcome of the struggle than those who have never left England," said Major Nybllett, whose home was at McLeod, Alberta, and who went to England with the First Canadian Division.

"The spirit of the men who come back wounded, many of them maimed for life, is marvellous," said Major Nybllett. "There is never a complaint. On the way over it was the same. Not one of the men ever uttered a complaint. They accepted the situation in a most heroic manner."

The men on the Metagama are all permanently out of commission, or at least none of them are likely to recover sufficiently to get back into the present war. There were men ill, others with an arm or a leg missing, others blind or suffering from gas, but there was no kick coming.

"With reference to the brutality of the Germans, there was one case on board that will give some idea of some of the things they do," said Major Nybllett.

There was a young fellow named McPhail, from Brandon, who was shot through the eye at Ypres and was afterwards taken prisoner. A week later the Germans put him on an operating table, and while two men held his arms and another lay over his body while the

surgeon cut his eye without giving him any anesthetic whatever.

"An Englishman doesn't want an anesthetic," said the doctor who performed the operation. The shock was so intense when they cut through the optic nerve that McPhail became unconscious and did not recover for twenty-four hours."

NOVA SCOTIA SCOTS FOR GRENADEER GUARDS

In reference to the recruiting for the Montreal Grenadier Guards the Montreal Gazette says:

General McNeigh said that many enquiries had been received from Nova Scotia. "Already some recruits had been received from there and it was likely that a recruiting detachment would be sent to get a platoon or two of Nova Scotia Scots to fill out the Grenadiers."
