

## Mayor White Suggests Full Time Instructor For Nurses' Training School at G. P. H.

A SUGGESTION that a full time instructor be engaged for the nurses' training school of the General Public Hospital was brought before the Board of Commissioners of the hospital yesterday afternoon by the training school committee.

Mayor Dr. W. W. White had first made the suggestion, and he explained that he would not advocate anything that would increase the maintenance cost.

The plan was to reduce the monthly payments of student nurses and to do away with the position of assistant superintendent of nurses, and to use the money made available to pay the instructor's salary.

The student nurses receive \$8 a month in the first year and \$8 a month in the second and third years.

Dr. White said the present method of having the city physicians give lectures was not satisfactory, as the doctors often had to be called away and the superintendent of nurses had to take their places. For the doctors also the present system was hardly fair, as it took so much of their time.

Dr. E. J. Ryan spoke against Mayor White's suggestion.

He pointed out that an instructor qualified to teach the many subjects the nurses must learn would have to be paid a large salary and might be hard to obtain. He said also, that in the matter of salary, the instructor could not be given more than the superintendent of nurses or an unsatisfactory situation would arise.

UNWISE, HE THINKS.

Dr. Ryan believed that cutting the amount of salary paid to student nurses would be unwise, and he considered the sum paid now was small enough. He also held that it would be inadvisable

INSTITUTION TO BE SEEN

Provincial Cabinet Committee Likely to Visit Sanitarium at River Glade Shortly

The committee is composed of Hon. D. A. Stewart, minister of public works, as chairman; Premier Baxter, Hon. Dr. H. I. Taylor, minister of health; Hon. Lewis Smith, minister of agriculture, and Hon. A. J. Leger, provincial secretary-treasurer.

OBJECTION MADE TO U. S. MAGAZINE

Local G. W. V. A. Acts—Delegates to Provincial Meeting Named

The Saint John G. W. V. A. will communicate with the local members in the federal house drawing their attention to an American magazine referred to recently in an editorial in The Telegraph-Journal under the heading "A scurrilous article". The local members will be asked by the Vets to take up with the federal authorities the matter of banning this type of literature from Canada. This action was decided upon at the meeting of the G. W. V. A. last night.

## Cabinet Kelvinators

Model 233—\$610. This is a deluxe cabinet of gleaming white porcelain, handsomely metal trimmed, the interior, too, is of white vitreous porcelain, and is easily kept spotlessly clean. Its outside dimensions are 67-1/4 inches high, 40-1/4 inches wide, and 24 inches deep. It has 12 square feet of shelf space with food storage capacity of 9-1/2 cubic feet. The Kelvinator has four trays in which 84 cubes of ice (12 lbs.) can be frozen in one time. Cork-board insulation is used throughout.

Model 231—\$585. This model is the same as that described above except that the cabinet is of choice flush-panel plywood construction, finished in the very highest quality white enamel pyroxylin. This is of the hardest and most durable white enamel.

Model 232—\$595. Dimensions, construction, arrangement and ice capacity of this model are the same as those of model 231 except that the exterior is of quarter sawed golden oak.

Model 229—\$410. This is a smaller deluxe model, also of white vitreous porcelain, beautifully trimmed with polished metal corners and edging. The interior, too, is of white vitreous porcelain. The outside dimensions are 48-1/2 inches high, 29-1/2 inches wide, and 24 inches deep. It has 9-1/2 square feet of shelf space permitting you to make excellent use of the food storage compartment of 5-1/2 cubic feet capacity. The trays permit you to freeze 42 cubes of ice (6 lbs.) at a time. The insulation consists of the very highest quality corkboard throughout.

Model 227—\$375. This model is the same as Model 229, except that the exterior is of hard wood construction with mahogany panels, finished in the very best quality white enamel pyroxylin.

Model 228—\$375. Similar to Model 227 except that the exterior is of quarter sawed golden oak.

Model 226—\$340. The dimensions of this model are the same as those of the three preceding ones. The interior is glossy white enamel on galvanized iron. This type of construction has been highly refined in the manufacture of these cabinets and is extremely handsome and very durable.

Model 230—\$340. Cabinet is exactly the same in size and construction as Model 226 except exterior is of rich golden oak.
