Mayor White Suggests Full Gloucester Co. Time Instructor For Nurses' Man, Struck By Training School at G. P. H. Lightning, Dies BATHURST, June 11-Henry Theriault, of Blue Cove, died in the J. H. Dunn Hospital here, today. Theriault was struck by lightning during a severe storm which passed over the Caraquet district on Tuesday last and severely burned and shocked. He was brought to the hospital here and everything possible done to save his life, but all means were without avail. Several others who were in his vicinity when he was struck were slightly shocked by the bolt. Blue Cove is a small village on the coast of the Bay Chaleur, about 30 miles east of Bathurst.

the money made available to pay the instructor's salary. The student nurses receive \$6 a month in the first year and \$8 a month in the second and third years. Dr. White said the present method of having the city physicians give lectures was not satisfactory, as the doctors often had to be called away and the superintendent of nurses had to take their places. For the doctors also the present system was hardly fair, as it took so much of their time. Dr. E. J. Ryan spoke against Mayor White's suggestion.
