HUGE SUMS LOST TO CANADA BY GRAIN EXPORTS

Sending of Our Wheat Through U. S. Ports Raises Pointed Comment

LACK OF MONTREAL EQUIPMENT BLAMED

C. B. Watts, Toronto, Says Loss Will Continue While Those in Control Sleep

TORONTO, Ont., Dec. 14—Commenting on Export statistics which show that the bulk of Canadian grain transported to Europe is shipped via United States ports, C. B. Watts, a Toronto authority on wheat, said today:

"Immense sums of money are being lost to Canada, and we will go on losing it just so long as those in control of the situation are asleep—it is time people woke up."

"I have given the matter a good deal of thought, but I am not going to say anything about it until there is some sign of action being taken," he declared. "Giving my opinion now would just be wasting it on the desert air."
