Hoe Shot For Civil Service Comm

Dr. Hodgetts Shows up Incom-petence of Body to Deal With Professional Things.

Ottawa, May 16.—A bitter attack on the civil service commission is made here by Dr. C. A. Hodgetta, in amouncing his resignation from the health department.

In a statement made last night, Dr. Hodgetts says:—

"After ten years of service with the commission of conservation as medical adviser of public health and after four years of service overgess (1914-1918) and the commission of conservation to the department of health by order-in-council which gave me the privileges as regards ealary which I enjoyed while with the commission, and I fully expect the scrap of paper' would be lowed up to.
