

KENNEDY, JAMES BUCKHAM (*New Westminster City*).

Father a native of Foss, Perthshire, and mother, from Dumblane, Scotland, came to Can. early in present century, and settled near Bytown, now Ottawa City. B. in Bytown in 1814, and ed. there. M. in New Westminster, 1880, Joséphine DeBeck (she d.), and again in Winnipeg, 1891, Mary Adelaide Lloyd. Is a lumberman. Has served as an Alderman and in the School Board of New Westminster. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Liberal.—*Sapperton, New Westminster, B.C.*

KIDD, THOMAS (*Westminster, Richmond Riding*).

Parents were North of Ireland Presbyterians of Scottish origin. B. in Co. Down, Irel., 23 Feb., 1846, and ed. there. Settled in B.C. in 1874, having first spent some years in New Zealand and California. M., 1883, Miss L. C. Smith. Is a farmer. Has been Reeve and Councillor in the Municipality of Richmond for several years. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. Opposed to the Turner Administration.—*Lulu Island.*

KITCHEN, THOMAS EDWIN (*Chilliwack*).

Third s. of Thomas and Jane Kitchen, of Dalton, in Furness, Lancashire, Eng. B. 18 Dec., 1852, at Haverthwaite, near Lakeside, Windermere, Lancashire. Ed. and was pupil teacher at National schools, Wimbledon, Surrey, M., Feb., 1882, Margaret C. Skovgaard, Bornholm, Denmark. Is a farmer, and is Reeve of Chilliwack. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1890, and re-elected at g. e., 1894. A Liberal-Conservative.—*Chilliwack.*

MACPHERSON, ROBERT (*Vancouver City*).

Eldest s. of Ritchie and Mary MacPherson, Bankhead, Largs, Ayrshire, Scot. B. at Inverkip, Renfrewshire, 11 Dec., 1853, and ed. at the Common school there. Settled in Manitoba in 1882, and removed to Vancouver in 1886. M., 21 Feb., 1894, Jane Elizabeth Sinclair. Is a carpenter and builder. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Liberal.—*Vancouver, B.C.*

MCGREGOR, JAMES (*Nanaimo City*).

Parents, from Scotland, settled in B.C. in 1849. B. in B.C., and ed. there. Unmarried. Is a merchant. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Government supporter.—*Nanaimo.*
