Family of Scotch extraction. B. in Fredericton, N.B., 7 March, 1844. M., 31 Oct., 1866, Annie E., eldest dau. of George Thompson, Esq., Educational Department, Fredericton. Educated at the Collegiate Sch., Fredericton. Called to the Bar, April, 1866. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1878. Resigned seat on petition being filed against his return, and on the issue of a new writ was re-elected 14 Nov., 1878. Re-elected at g.e. 1882. Called upon to form an administration, which he succeeded in doing 3 Mar., 1883. Re-elected on his acceptance of office as Attorney-General, 24. Mar., 1883, and again at g.e. 1886. A Liberal.—*Fredericton, N.B.*

BURCHILL, JOHN PERCIVAL. (Northumberland.) 2nd mem.

B. at Miramichi, N.B., 1855. Is a mem. of the firm of Geo. Burchill & Sons, merchants, there. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1882. Re-elected March, 1887, to fill the vacancy caused by resignation of Mr. Adams, the mem. elect, to run for the Commons. A Liberal.—*Nelson, N.B.*

DOUGLAS, WILLIAM. (Charlotte.)

Of Scotch descent. B. in St. Andrews, N.B., and ed. at St. Stephen. M., 1865, Sarah Eldridge. Is a farmer and lumber merchant, and has been a County Councillor for ten years. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1882. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Moore's Mills, N.B.*

EMMERSON, HENRY ROBERT. (Albert.) 2nd mem.

Grandf., John Emerson, came from England. Mother's father descended from a New England family.
