A physician. Is Vice-President of the Levis & Kennebec Railway. Raised in 1863 the 17th Batt. of Volunteer Infantry, of which he was appd. Lieut.-Col. and has since commanded. Commanded the 3rd Administrative Batt. on Frontier service during the St. Albans' Raid, 1865; and was in command of the active Militia force on the south shore of the St. Lawrence (Quebec District) during the Fenian Raid in 1866, and again in 1870. Was Speaker of the House of Assembly of the Province of Quebec from the meeting of the First Parliament after the Union in 1867, until its dissolution, 1870. Was Mayor of Levis for six years. Sat for present seat in L.A., Can., from g. e., 1861, until the Union. Was an unsuccessful candidate for same seat at g. e., 1857. Returned by acclamation at last g. e., Represented Levis in Local House. A Liberal Conservative; supports the present administration.—*Levis*.
