MORRISON, THOMAS FLETCHER. [Colchester.]

Family originally from Scot., removed to Irel. many years ago. Great grand-f. emigrated to Am. Colonies. S. of the late Mr. Joseph Morrison, a native of Londonderry, N. S., by Isabella Fletcher, and grands. of Mr. Morrison, who removed to N. S. from New Hampshire, 1860, and sat in the N. S. Parlt. for many years. Londonderry, N. S. 22 Feb., 1808. Ed. there. M., 1st., 1838, Miss Hannah Faulkner (who d. 1842); 2ndly, 1844, Miss Margaret B. Fletcher. Was a Master Mariner for many years. Is Emmigrant Agent for N. S., and Surveyor of Shipping at Londonderry. Introduced and carried through the N. S. Legislature, the act establishing vote by Sat for North Colchester from ballot at elections. 1855 to 1863. First returned for Colchester at last g. e. - Londonderry, N. S.
