The Commissioners are of opinion that a sum of about £150 is required to complete that Road, including the building of a Bridge. The Road from the south-west branch to the Road of Dudswell is thirty-eight miles and sixty-seven chains, the ground is rather hilly, but capable of being culti-No. 38, £350. vated; no work has been done on that Road, except that it has been explored and laid down. missionners consider that a further sum of £200 is re-

Your Committee next examined the Report of the Commissionners for opening the Road from the southwest branch of Tring to Craig's Road in Leeds; that Road is twenty four miles and forty-three chains in length, it has been opened in its whole extent on a width of twelve feet, the stumps have been cut on a level with the ground; this Road has been made by contract. The lands in the neighbourhood of the Road are of a superior quality, and belong to the Crown; a sum of £300 had been appropriated for the opening of that Road; there remains a balance of No. 39, £150. £4 128, 5½d. in the hands of the Commissionners,
